

AngioDynamics Granted Summary Judgment Motion On Willfulness in VNUS Litigation

QUEENSBURY, N.Y.--(BUSINESS WIRE)--Oct. 29, 2007--AngioDynamics (NASDAQ:ANGO) today announced that its motion for summary judgment of no willful infringement was granted in the U.S. District Court in the Northern District of California in the patent litigation brought by VNUS Medical Technologies against Diomed, AngioDynamics and Vascular Solutions.

Judge Maxine Chesney found that VNUS was not able to establish that AngioDynamics willfully infringed the VNUS patents, ruling that willful infringement is not a triable issue against AngioDynamics. The impact of the ruling prevents the potential tripling of damages in the event that a jury finds infringement by AngioDynamics.

The trial start date has been delayed; a new start date has not been set due to time constraints of the court.
